NEWSWORTHY ITEMS

I would like to congratulate all our 2023 high school graduates and all our VCS students on a successful school year.

This year's Memorial Day Parade included bagpipes, a band on a wagon, and as always, many youth groups and our first responders. I also want to thank the members of American Legion Post 931 and our entire community for a wonderful turnout of support on a beautiful day.

The Parks & Recreation Citizens' Advisory Committee and members of the cycling community in the Town presented the Town Board with safety concerns earlier this year. The Town Board responded and has authorized the Highway Superintendent to purchase 57 bicycle signs. The highway department will most likely have these signs installed by the time you have read this article.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT REQUEST

We wish to thank you for responding to the request for enhanced road patrol and the portable radar signs. A couple of notes related to these requests: The Highway Department has a few portable signs that move around periodically. The Board has authorized the Highway Superintendent to purchase six solar powered speed signs to be installed throughout the town. I would anticipate that more of these will be ordered and installed either later this year or next year.

I am in the process of scheduling a meeting with the Sheriff's department and the NY State Police to review areas where additional traffic enforcement is necessary. These areas that we will ask for support are a direct result of the feedback that you, the residents, have requested through the Town's Online Submittal Form. I do want everyone to know that both Law Enforcement departments continue to deal with manpower shortages. We increase our hours for additional patrols with the Sheriff's department annually. Unfortunately, over the course of the year they are not able to provide us with the coverage we need. I am by no means saying this in a derogatory way, instead pointing out that the lack of staffing is preventing some of our goals from being met.

VETERANS MEMORIAL MONUMENT DEDICATION CEREMONY

In addition to celebrating Flag Day on June 14, 2023, we dedicated the new Veterans Memorial Monument at Town Hall. Town Clerk Karen Bodine opened the Ceremony with the singing of our National Anthem. Councilman Ed Kahovec and I identified and thanked many visionaries and champions for this project including current and past American Legion members. Post 931 Commander, Troy Shelton, offered some very appropriate comments of thanks and meaning for this dedication. Our NYS delegation of Assemblywoman Marjorie Byrne and Senator Pam Helming added some very powerful remarks that tied Flag Day and this dedication together. A very special treat was the singing of the Grand Old Flag song by 5-year-old Hayden Cusimano and 4-year-old Emma Banach. The Ceremony closed with the playing of Taps by Victor resident Logan Everhart. Please review some of the wonderful photos that were taken following the ceremony. **(Photos on pages: 28-29)** I would like to thank the large turnout of the public and the many first responders who attended this ceremony.

The Victor Garden Club is working with the Town's Parks Department to enhance this area for your pleasure. A few days after the ceremony a resident notified the Town Clerk and me about donating a bench in memory of her late husband-more to follow on this. Please stop by and see the additional flags that have been added to recognize all branches of our Military, Homeland Security, and POW's. It is the hope of American Legion Post 931 and the Town Board that we have honored all those Veterans who have made the ultimate sacrifice with this Monument and garden area.

DOG LICENSES

Please take advantage of the online dog licensing portal to **renew** existing dog licenses. Unfortunately,

the portal cannot be used to register a new dog. In order to renew online, your dog's rabies vaccination must be valid. You can email the rabies information to the clerk's office at townclerk@town-victor-ny.us or call so we can update the record. Note: there is a small fee to use the online dog portal of \$1.75.

*We ask that you update any changes concerning your dog's license. *Thank you.*



BOUGHTON PARK PASSES

The Clerk's office issues your hang tags for Boughton Park. You must be a Victor resident or Town of Victor taxpayer to obtain a Boughton Park Pass. Your current car registration is required to receive a pass. If you have questions, please call the office (585)-742-5080.

TOWN NEWS

HOW TO OBTAIN A MARRIAGE LICENSE

It is not necessary to obtain a Marriage License in the municipality in which the applicants are being married and you do not need to be a resident of the Town of Victor to apply in our office. Marriage Licenses applied for in any Clerks office are valid for ceremonies held within New York State. The cost is \$40.

HUNTING LICENSES

You need a hunting license if you are:

- 12 years and older and using a firearm or bow to hunt or take wild game. Persons under age 12 cannot hunt.

◇ Junior Hunters (12-15): review regulations and information for junior hunters, ages 12-15.

JUNIOR HUNTERS INFORMATION

◇ Additional Privileges/Permits: depending on the season and species you are hunting you may need

additional privileges or permits.

You do not need a hunting license if you are:

- A resident landowner primarily engaged in farming (including lessees and members of their immediate families) when small game hunting on farmlands they are occupying and cultivating.
- A Native American living and hunting on reservation land.
- Hunting on a licensed shooting preserve or big game shooting facility.

Note: To hunt turkey, all hunters must purchase a turkey permit. There are no exceptions.

Important STAR information

Autumn is just around the corner and so are school tax bills! The most often asked question is about the STAR program. If you are eligible and enrolled in the STAR program, you'll receive your benefit one of two ways:

STAR CREDIT CHECK

If you are registered for the STAR credit, the Tax Department will send you a STAR check in the mail each year, usually in September. You can use the check to pay your school taxes. You can receive the STAR credit if you own your home and it's your primary residence and the combined income of the owners and the owners' spouse is \$500,000 or less.

STAR EXEMPTION.

A reduction on your school tax bill. If you've been receiving the STAR exemption since 2015, you can continue to receive it for the same primary residence. As long as you remain eligible, you'll see a reduction on your school tax bill for your STAR exemption. Note: The STAR exemption is no longer available to new homeowners.

WHY SWITCH TO THE STAR CREDIT FROM THE STAR EXEMPTION?

If you currently receive your STAR benefit as a reduction on your school tax bill (the STAR exemption), you may receive a greater benefit if you switch to the STAR credit to receive a check instead. The exemption amounts are capped at \$477 for the Basic STAR and \$1,074 for the Enhanced STAR in the Victor School District. The value of the STAR credit savings may increase by as much as 2% each year. Go to <https://www.tax.ny.gov/pit/property/star/> or call NYS Department of Taxation and Finance at (518) 457-2037 to register or make the switch.



If you are receiving the Basic STAR exemption and are turning 65 this year, please submit the completed Enhanced STAR application and Enhanced STAR Income Verification form along with any necessary supporting documentation to the office by March 1, 2024. Applications are available at <https://www.victorny.org/155/Exemption-Forms>. Receiving the STAR credit? You're all set! The State reviews your age and income annually and will transfer you to the Enhanced STAR program if you qualify. More information can be found at <https://www.tax.ny.gov/star/>.

Town of Victor Highway Department

The Town Highway Department fall/winter hours are 7:00 A.M. – 3:30 P.M., Monday through Friday, October 30, 2023, through Friday, March 29, 2024. Please note the Highway/Transfer Station **Office hours are Monday – Friday 7:00 A.M. – 3:30 P.M. year-round.**

There is no roadside brush pick up within the Town. Brush and yard debris can be dumped, with a Transfer Station permit, Monday – Friday, 7:00 A.M. – 3:30 P.M. (Wednesday until 8:00 P.M.) and Saturday 7:00 A.M. – 1:00 P.M. **In order to dump brush, you must have a Transfer Station permit.**

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

The following roadwork has been completed for this construction season:

Milling and Paving – Chapel Hill (Phase 1), Wellington Drive, Oak Ridge Drive, Pine Tree Drive, Silvertown Glen (Ashwood to cul-de-sac), and Bramwell Park

Crack Filling – High Street, Anton Rise, Canterbury Trail, Chestnut Hill, Dorsett Trail, Kensington Court, Taylor Rise, and Whistle Stop Road

Chip sealing – Strong Road (County Road 41 to NYS 251),

Modock Road, Malone Road (County Road 41 to Dryer Road), Turner Drive, Pilgrim Pass, and Oakwood Drive

Reprofiling – Blazey Road, Bortle Road, Brownsville Road, Cline Road, Gillis Road (County Road 9 to Cline Road), Lane Road (High Street to County Road 9), Richardson Road, and Lynaugh Road

Micropaving – Burlington Road, Golfview Rise, Hillside Drive, Rabbit Ear Pass, Silver Hill Path, and Song Hill Lane

Reconstruction/Capital Road Projects – Willis Hill Road and Railroad Mills

HIGHWAY WORK PERMITS

All work within the Town right-of-way requires a Highway Permit. An application must be completed and a check for \$25 submitted to the Highway Superintendent at 60 Rawson Road, Victor, NY 14564. DEER REMOVAL

Undoubtedly, there will be some deer carcasses that are found in the public right-of-ways. Please report any deer found as follows:

- On County Roadways call 396-4000
- On State Roadways call 396-4955
- On Village Roadways call 924-3311
- On Town Roadways call 742-5094
- Deer/wildlife removal outside of the public right-of-way can be removed by animal removal services.

TRANSFER STATION

The Town of Victor established the Transfer Station for residents to dispose of garbage and recyclable materials many years ago. This is not intended to be used as a place for residents who own contracting businesses and reside in the Town to dispose of large quantities of construction materials, tree/yard debris,

recyclables, or refuse. We will take commercial businesses recyclables, but only in manageable quantities. We do not have the space to accommodate these quantities of materials and it is an added burden to all taxpayers when it is used in that capacity. Please respect the rules set in place, so that we can retain this great asset for our community and manage the costs to run the facility.

Transfer Station Permits:

Transfer Station/Recycle permits can be purchased at the Highway Department, 60 Rawson Road, Building

“B”. Transfer station permits are for disposal of household garbage, recyclables, tree, and brush debris, four tires, use of the Swap Shop and the mulch.

Residential transfer station/recycle permits are \$140 (2 per household). Proof of residency and the registration of the vehicle (s) that will be used in the facility will be required.

Senior transfer station/recycle permits (must be 65 or older – proof is required at time of purchase) are \$125 (2 per household). Must have proof of residency and the registration of the vehicle (s) that will be used in the facility will be required.

Commercial recycling permits are \$140 (2 per business). Commercial permits are for recyclable **materials only**. Proof that your business is a Village or Town business will be required, along with the registration of the vehicle(s) that will be used in the facility.

Organics Only permits \$100 (2 per household). This is for residents who have private or Village garbage service and wish to use the bucket exchange program and drop off tree, leaves and brush debris **ONLY**.

Permit Renewals:

Permit holders will receive a renewal letter 2-3 weeks prior to expiration of the Transfer Station/Recycle permit. Permits can be renewed by mailing a check for \$140 or \$125 if you are 65 or older (made payable to the Town of Victor) along with any vehicle

changes to the Transfer Station Office at 60 Rawson Road, Building B, Victor, NY 14564. Over the phone renewals can be made using a credit card (2.15% processing fee for all credit cards). Permits can also be renewed in person at the Transfer Station Office or placed in the drop box when the office is closed.

Punch Cards:

A punch card will be required to dump bulky items (sofa, entertainment centers, mattresses, box springs, miscellaneous items from garage/basement clean outs) and construction type materials (wood, shingles, rugs, tiles, cabinets, linoleum, windows, siding, fence). **This will be required for dumping any amount of this type of material.** The cost for the card is \$130 (5 punches) and is valid until all five punches are used. Only **one card will be issued per year**. Proof of residency is required at time of purchase.

- 1 punch = 1 large item or 1 truck, car or utility trailer load of debris
- 2 punches = Utility trailer larger than 10’ long or a truck/car + utility trailer load of material

Clean metal will be accepted as recyclable material and will not require purchase of a punch card (example – metal bed frames, springs, metal appliances (NO refrigerators or propane tanks – free at ALPCO) mowers, copper/metal piping, metal stakes, metal grills, etc.)

Electronics:

We are no longer accepting electronics at the Transfer Station. Electronics can be recycled through EWaste+, 7318 Victor-Mendon Road (Route 251), Victor, New York 14564. Drop off hours are Monday – Friday, 8:00 A.M. – 4:00 P.M. For more details or for additional drop-off locations go to www.ewaste.com. The County offers electronic recycle events during the year.

RECYCLABLES (Please sort as follows and do not place recyclables in plastic bags)

Tires:

There is a 4-tire limit for recycling tires. Coupons are issued at the time of permit purchase or renewal. The tire bin is inside the Transfer Station and tires **will not** be accepted without the coupons.

Metal:

- Metal food and beverage containers, please rinse
- Appliances - except refrigerators, these can be disposed of at ALPCO for free
- Any ferrous and non-ferrous metals (steel, aluminum, copper, tin, brass)
- NO refrigerators or propane tanks - can be disposed of at ALPCO for free

Plastics:

- Bottles, jugs, containers #1-7
- NO Toys, hangers, rubber maid containers or thermoform plastic

Glass:

- Bottles, jars

Cardboard:

- Corrugated cardboard (wavy center layer)

Paper:

- Dry food boxes, paper bags, paper egg cartons, junk mail, periodicals, newspaper, catalogs, office paper, and shredded paper
- NO HARDCOVER BOOKS, TISSUES, TOILET PAPER

ORGANICS

In an effort to initiate waste diversion, the Town Board has approved and adopted an organics recycling program through Impact Earth. This is done through a bucket exchange and will now be an option as part of the residential Transfer Station Permit. Currently over 160 Transfer Station permit holders take advantage of this program. BRUSH AND MULCH AREA:

Must have a Transfer Station Permit
Open Monday through Friday 7:00 A.M. – 3:30 P.M. (Wednesday until 8:00 P.M.) 7:00 A.M. – 1:00 P.M. on Saturdays. **Please plan ahead and make sure you dump debris before closing time. Gates will be closed at 3:30pm!!**

SORT PROCEDURES

Please place all grass and loose leaves on the left side of bin and wood and branches on right side of bin. This is part of our waste diversion initiative and will help with processing mulch.

When dumping brush or related items, such as grass clippings, please remember – NO Plastic Bags. Much of this material is turned into mulch and made available to residents.

VALID PERMITS MUST BE DISPLAYED OR HANDED TO THE ATTENDANTS IN ORDER TO DUMP AT THE TRANSFER STATION. NO PERMIT, NO DUMPING WILL BE ALLOWED.

WHEN ENTERING THE TRANSFER STATION, PLEASE MAKE SURE THE ONLY ITEMS IN

YOUR TRUNK OR BACK OF VEHICLE ARE YOUR REFUSE/RECYCLING. MISSING ITEMS WILL NOT BE COMPENSATED FOR OR REPLACED!

ALL CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS REQUIRES THE PURCHASE OF A PUNCH CARD AND MUST BE BROUGHT IN BY RESIDENTS WITH PERMITS ONLY.

NO GARBAGE CANS OVER 75 POUNDS

ABSOLUTELY NO DUMP TRUCKS/TRAILERS ALLOWED IN THE RECYCLE FACILITY

SAFETY

Please be aware of attendants while unloading and moving through the building. Again, thank you for “thinking safety” while using this facility.

Due to liability and safety concerns, NO LOITERING or going through containers will be allowed at the Transfer Station. Anyone caught doing so will be asked to leave the facility.

Should you have any questions on where an item should go, please see an attendant. Thank you again for your continued safe use of this facility.

REASONS TO CONSIDER USING THE TRANSFER STATION:



PERMIT, EVENT AND BOAT RACK REGULATIONS

Park Use by Permit ONLY

- Free permits are issued by Town Clerk to residents of the Towns of East Bloomfield, West Bloomfield and Victor.
- You must apply to the Town Clerk in the township where you live
- All permits must be displayed prominently

Boughton Park Hang Tag Permit Process - New:

When applying for a new Boughton Park Hang Tag Permit:

1. You must bring your driver's license, car registration and proof of residency to the Town Clerk's office where you live
2. A new tag will be issued

Boughton Park Hang Tag Process - Renewal:

To renew your expired hang tag permit:

1. You must bring in your expired hang tag to the Town Clerk's Office.
2. There will be a \$5.00 charge if expired permit is not returned at the time of renewal
3. You must bring your driver's license, car registration and proof of residency.
4. A new tag will be issued.

EAST BLOOMFIELD DOG CONTROL LAW

As of November 2014, the Town of East Bloomfield has adopted a Dog Control Law that pertains to all dog owners within the town limits. This includes Boughton Park. All owners must be in complete control of their dog at all times while in Boughton Park, as well

as anywhere within the Town of East Bloomfield. Contact the East Bloomfield Town Clerk at 585-657-6515 for a copy of the Dog Control Law, Local Law #2 of 2014.

EVENT POLICY

The Boughton Park Board of Directors periodically receives requests for organized group events within the Park. It is difficult to predict the impact of these events, i.e., size of the group, needed parking, the number of other visitors in the park, etc. As a result, the following policy applies to all group events in the Park:

Organized town groups (churches, scouts, Bloomfield or Victor School classes, etc.) should contact Member Claudia Walsh by email at: boughtonparkinfo@gmail.com at least two months in advance, to discuss specific details for any desired Park event.

For other private groups & organizations, the following rules apply:

- The maximum size of the group is 25 people.
- The maximum number of cars for the group is limited to 10.
- Either or both parking lots may be used, however the maximum still applies.
- The Stirnie Road picnic pavilion may be used. The reservation system should be used by contacting Member Claudia Walsh by email at: boughtonparkinfo@gmail.com as early as possible, as this is a limited resource available to all residents.
- No permanent or temporary structures can be brought in or constructed in the Park for any event.
- A representative of the event must make a request & provide documented details to the Boughton Park Board of Directors at least 2 months in advance of the planned event date.
- Depending on the size, the group must pay in advance, the rental fee for any additional porta-johns on site during the event. The Boughton Park Board of Directors will schedule the drop-off & pickup of the unit.
- Only 1 event can be scheduled on any one day in the Park. First requested is first granted.
- The group must identify one responsible individual to act as contact for the Town & Park. This representative will attend the event & be responsible for the event and its use of the Park before, during, and immediately after the event (i.e., including cleanup).

DONATIONS TO THE PARK ARE ALWAYS WELCOME.

All other Park rules and regulations apply, including:

- All parked cars must have a tag and be within the two designated parking areas.
- All fishing is CATCH & RELEASE ONLY
- No alcohol in the Park.
- Swimming is prohibited anywhere in the Park.
- This is a carry-in carry-out Park. Nothing is to be left in the Park after the event.

SPECIAL USE PERMITS

Groups of 25 or more require Special Use Permits. These permits are issued by the Boughton Park Board of Directors. Applications shall be in writing including dates, specific use, and insurance coverage where applicable. Contact Member Claudia Walsh by email at: boughtonparkinfo@gmail.com for more information.

BOAT RACK POLICY

Applications will be accepted at the East Bloomfield Town Hall, beginning the 2nd Monday in March of each year.

Applications will be accepted on a first come first served basis, with preference going to:

- Handicapped first
- Seniors Citizens second
- Opened to all if spaces are left
- Permits may be picked up by April 15th
- Permits that are not picked up by April 30 will be given to the next person on the list.
- All boats must be removed by November 15th or they will be moved to the barn at

a cost of \$15.00 and charged a daily rent in the amount of \$5.00 per day with a maximum of \$100.00.

- The canoes will be considered abandoned by January 1 and will be sold at auction on April 15 of the following year.

Canoe/Boat Permit holders are required to use their slips by July 1st or forfeit the permits. Usage will be monitored and if it is observed that the slips are infrequently utilized, the permit may be revoked and the slip assigned to another user.

We are approaching July and these last sixth months have gone by fast. We have continued to serve the residents of our community with the utmost skill and care. From January 1st to June 15th, we've received 1334 calls for service, which is an increase of 4.5% from this time last year. We have also increased our staffing, which allows us to staff 2 crews 24 hours a day more often.

I am happy to announce that many of the COVID-19 restrictions have finally been removed. Currently our providers are required to wear surgical masks only on calls where respiratory precautions have been advised, or if the facility we are responding to requires mask usage. We will continue to take every precaution to ensure our equipment and vehicles are clean, and our patients and providers are safe.

We have also had the opportunity to attend a lot of events in our community. We participated in the escorting of section V and state championship winning Victor High School teams. We also participated in the DWI simulation drill held at Victor High School on May 31st. This was held at the high school to show the dangers of

drinking and driving. We have participated in this event for many years and are proud to be a part of this educational experience.

Chief Palmer and I had the privilege to honor our veterans on June 14th as we attended the dedication for the Veterans Memorial Statue located in front of the Victor town hall. The dedication ceremony was very powerful, and it was great to see the support for our veterans from not only fire and EMS, but Senator Helming and Assemblywoman Byrnes.

Finally, Victor Farmington Ambulance was proud to honor crews from Victor Farmington and Victor Fire for saving the lives of a resident having a severe medical emergency. Senator Helming was in attendance and gave out commendation awards to the crew members. Representatives from the town of Victor were also on hand to present commendations. The best part of the ceremony was the patient being in attendance, and he and his family were able to give their thanks in person. As the Chief of Operations, I was proud to acknowledge the fine efforts of these crew members.

2023 AARP Community Challenge Grant Awarded to Victor Hiking Trails

Victor Hiking Trails is pleased to announce that its application for a \$2500 AARP mini-grant was awarded. Out of the over 3600 applications submitted, from all fifty states, only 311 applicants were recognized with a grant.

Utilizing the funding, VHT, with the help of local residents, will be conducting a “Walk Audit” in the Village of Victor. A Walk Audit consists of volunteers literally walking an area bordered on the north by Main Street/96, on the south by the Auburn Trail, on the east by Maple Ave, and on the west by School Street. Utilizing a Walk Audit kit, we will be looking at sidewalks, curbs, bike lanes, access to trails, benches etc. Based

on our audit, we will create recommendations for improving the pedestrian experience of the designated area. The grant will also fund the counting of foot traffic, bicycles etc. This project will begin this summer and conclude in the fall.

Town of Victor Stormwater Management Update

The Town of Victor has been able to get several stormwater projects completed in the last year. The Highway Department has completed maintenance on 23 different stormwater facilities within the Town's Drainage Improvement Area. This work includes replacing pipes, maintaining structures, removing trees, and removing sediment that has built up over time. This work will help drainage in these areas flow as it was intended per the approved design of each stormwater facility as well as the treatment of stormwater in the Town of Victor.



Inspection is a major part of Stormwater Management for both illicit discharge detection and facility maintenance prioritization. Town of Victor staff inspected 84 outfalls in the last reporting year. Staff also inspected 87 catch basins in the last year. Any maintenance items found during inspections are prioritized and scheduled.

The Town of Victor also monitors stormwater runoff at active construction sites. There are currently 26 projects in Town that have active SWPPP coverage through the DEC. As part of the Town's Stormwater Management Plan, the Town monitors these sites for things like erosion and sediment control so they stay in compliance with their SWPPP coverage.



Do you know you can borrow more than just books at the library? The library has evolved to keep up with the ever-changing needs of the community, and while books are still very popular, there is much more to be borrowed at the Victor Farmington Library.

For example:

- A variety of passes including the Empire State Pass, which allows you to get in free to any NYS park, Rochester Museum and Science Center pass, New York Museum of Transportation pass, and Women's Hall of Fame pass.
- Library of Things: check out a metal detector, hiking poles, a ukulele, a hand drill, a sewing machine, a telescope, plus an enormous list of other "things".
- Kid's Discovery Kits, which are themed kits to help children learn.

Additionally, e-books, e-audiobooks, and e-magazines can easily be borrowed through the Libby app. You should never purchase an e-book online when there are tens of thousands of choices through the library catalog. We circulate around 3,000 e-books per month, and that number continues to grow. If you can't find what you're looking for, we also share e-book catalogs with the Finger Lakes Library System and the Southern Tier Library System, so there are seemingly endless choices. There are thousands of e-magazines you can download for free from the comfort of your home.

We also have dozens of monthly activities and classes for people of all ages. Regular children's activities include

story times and learn and play events. There are monthly craft kits for teens, along with unique events and activities. Adults can enjoy a friendly game of Euchre or Hand and Foot, or they can attend a class focused on astronomy or learn about local history like the local railroad or the Erie Canal. Our bi-weekly chair yoga and Tai Chi classes have also been incredibly popular. Having computer or tech troubles? We have tech support help every Wednesday morning.

With the variety of items that can be borrowed and the amount of activities going on, there are a number of reasons to use the library. If you don't have a library card yet, stop in and get one, and then see what's going on at your library. The cards are free and everything in the library can be borrowed for free, so there's every reason to get one and not a single reason not to. The library exists for the members of the community.

The Friends of the Victor Farmington Library will once again be holding a book sale in October at Eastview Mall. As of this writing, they haven't started collecting book donations nor have finalized a specific store front in the mall have, so please check our website or Facebook page for up-to-date information. The book sale is the only fundraising event for the group, and it's a great opportunity to purchase like-new books at a very reasonable cost. If you shopped at the last book sale in the spring, you'll know how well organized the sale was, along with the tremendous selection of books. We hope you'll find an opportunity to visit the sale this year and find some great deals.



Summer is moving along but there is still much good weather and many good times to enjoy! So, let's start this letter off with some information regarding upcoming events to be held in the Village.

SO. HIGH ST. CONSTRUCTION

The reconstruction of So. High Street began June 26th, the Monday after the school year ended. The goal ahead is to finish the project by Sept 1st prior to the start

of the new school year. I appreciate everyone's patience and understanding during this time of inconvenience. Once again hats off to John Turner and the Department of Public works staff as much of the work is being done in house saving tax payer dollars. The Village office staff deserves a thank you as well for answering phone calls and providing pertinent information to residents and business owners.

SPEEDING ISSUES

This past spring there was a lengthy project at the High Acres landfill in Fairport. Large dump trucks hauling fill dirt from the Richmond Hills area south of West Bloomfield were repeatedly using Maple Avenue and Church Street as the main hauling route to and from the landfill. Speeding issues were brought to my attention, and I thank those who called, emailed, or filed online complaints via the Town/Village website. With the help of DPW Director John Turner, we were able to determine who held the hauling contract for the project. Both John and myself made phone contact with the hauling contractor. Additional routes were implemented so that not all trips were made through the Village. At this point I believe the project is done for the time being. It is expected it will start again in the fall. We will stay on top of this if and when it occurs. We have also made the Ontario County Sheriff Office aware. For the future we may ask the NYS troopers for check point assistance as well. The contractor

was understanding of the problem and willing to cooperate. I would like to take this opportunity to ask that we remind ourselves, (me included) to do our best to observe Village speed limits for the safety of all.

PERSONNEL

I would like to take this opportunity to thank former Village Employee Jon McConnell. Jon retired in May after approximately 33 years of service to the Village of Victor. Jon was the Plant Operator at our Wastewater Treatment Plant on Brace Road for most of those years. Jon's knowledge and ability is missed. However, he is still in the area and available as a consultant should we need him. Congratulations Jon and best wishes on your retirement.

RESIDENTIAL PROJECTS

As you may know this has been a busy time for our Zoning and Planning boards. I thank them for their efforts. Two new housing projects were introduced in the Village. One is a 112-unit apartment complex for 55yrs and older residents, proposed for 160 School Street. The project

will be in front of the Village Planning Board in the Aug.-Sept time frame. The other is a 55-unit Town House rental complex at 47 East Street near the Great Brook Apartments at 45 East Street. The project received site plan approval at the April 26th Village Planning Board meeting.

DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION

The Village is currently working with the Town Local Development Corp., the Village Urban Renewal Agency and a committee of community volunteers to obtain grant funding from two resources available through the State of NY. These funds would be for facade improvements and possibly larger building improvements/projects.

Summer is almost over and that means it's pool closing season. The Village of Victor is part of the Ontario-Wayne Stormwater Collation and the municipal separate storm sewer system or MS4. The storm system is designed for rain and snow runoff only because it runs directly into our lakes and streams. Dumping your pool which is filled with chlorine can be toxic to fish, small crustaceans, and plankton. There are 2 ways to dechlorinate your pool before emptying, simply stop adding chlorine to your uncovered pool and wait and the sunlight will naturally dissipate the chlorine within 10 days. You may also chemically dechlorinate your pool water using kits from your local pool and spa dealer. The Village

has some brochures at the Village Hall if anyone has any questions or concerns about how to do this.

I would like to remind everyone that there is no parking for extended periods of time on your lawn. This is a local Village zoning code. Any trailer, boat trailer, camp trailer, recreational vehicle trailer or any trailer of any type must be parked or stored in the driveway and or rear of the house.


One last reminder that any roofing work, remodel or conversion of basements, additions, decks, new pools, and any accessory buildings (i.e., sheds) must have a building permit.

This summer, we completed the last major road reconstruction project in the Village. We replaced drainage, installed curbing, pavement and provided a 7 ft sidewalk for pedestrians and students, also a turning lane to help with traffic.

Completed a 2 million upgrade to our sewer treatment plant, including UV system, new digester covers.

FOR LEAF VACUUM

Approximate dates are October 19th through Thanksgiving or the first heavy snowfall. Place loose leaves in a row at the curb line. Please keep leaves out of gutters and ditches. This will help protect your property from flooding. Please do not place leaves around mailboxes or street poles, and keep leaves and brush separate, it is very difficult to remove them with the leaf vacuum.

BRUSH PICK-UP 2023

Just a reminder, Brush pick-up is on the first Monday of the week, first week is Victorwood, second week is Quail Ridge, Church Street, High Street and Moore Ave, and the third week is Jacob Landing, Main Street, School Street, Rawson Road, Drumlins, and Rothbury. Please don't put out brush until your designated week. Grass clippings need to be put in a paper leaf bag or a garbage can, no plastic bags. We do not vacuum leaves in the spring, so please put loose leaves in

a paper bag or garbage can. All brush needs to be cut into 4 ft lengths and bundled. If you have any large removals of brush, please contact the Village office. We do provide a rolloff service for the weekend for Village residents at a minimal cost.

Just a couple more things I would like to remind our residents about:

Please continue supporting our zero-sort recycling program. The more we recycle, the less the taxpayers pay to dispose of waste at the landfill.

Please do not pour grease, paints, thinners, or any prescription medicine down your drains. The Village treats everything that goes down the drain. Also, never flush rubber gloves, baby wipes, etc. down the toilet. These products can cause major problems at our wastewater treatment plant.

Village Brush & Yard Waste Collection

The Village's curbside Brush & Yard Waste Collection will continue through the third Monday in November (weather permitting) the Village will provide curbside brush and yard waste collection following a monthly schedule (Listed below). **Please place brush and yard waste at the curb no earlier than 6:00 P.M. the day prior to your scheduled collection day and no later than 7:00 A.M. of your scheduled collection day to insure pickup.** In order to keep on schedule, it is essential

that residents follow these procedures. Any brush which does not meet regulations, or is set out on the wrong date, will not be picked up. If you have any questions, please call the Department of Public Works at 924-2004, or the Village Hall at 924-3311. **If your Brush pickup falls on a Monday holiday, it will be picked up on Tuesday.**

The Village of Victor no longer collects yard and garden waste bagged in plastic. Yard and garden waste may be placed in a can or receptacle; filled weight not to exceed 75

pounds. Larger brush and tree limbs should be bundled, with rope or twine (not wire), in bundles no longer than 4 feet long, or weighing more than 75 pounds. Residents interested in bagging their materials should use large paper leaf bags. These 30-gallon paper bags are available for purchase at most home and garden stores. Do not rake, sweep or place yard waste of any kind on street pavement or gutters as they may clog the drains.
