

LEHIGH CROSSING PARK

This park offers a very diverse environment with a large network of multiuse trails and opportunities to view wildlife. The park is connected to the Auburn and Lehigh Valley rail trails as well as the Trolley Trail and Dryer Road Park connector and has a seasonal restroom facility. A fishing pond is centrally located within the park and numerous amphibians, waterfowl and birds call this park their home. Future plans include an outdoor classroom / nature education area and new fishing dock.

Acreage: 54 Acres
Length of Trails: 3 Miles
Location: Victor-Mendon Road (NYS Rte. 251)

VILLAGE ON THE PARK

This neighborhood park, which is located off of County Road 9, has several areas for public use. The northern portion of the park includes a large open meadow, multiuse trails, a sledding hill with a connection to the "Helen's Way" trail and a small parking area at the County Road 9 trailhead. The central park includes a children's playground, picnic area and a small parking area. Two small-sided soccer fields, a large parking area and a seasonal restroom facility can be found at the park's south section. Future plans include additional soccer and lacrosse fields, a trail connection to Mary Frances Bluebird Haven, year-round restrooms and a new pavilion.

Acreage: 70 Acres
Length of Trail: 2 Miles
Location: Victor-Egypt Road (County Road 9) just north of the NYS Thruway.



VICTOR MUNICIPAL PARK

Located on 47-acres within the Village of Victor, this community park includes an enclosed lodge, year-round restrooms, picnic shelter, fishing pond with accessible dock, large children's playground, trails and beach volleyball court. The park's bandshell and amphitheater play host to the Sid Partington Summer Concert in the Park series. A multiuse trail system offers connections to the Jacob's Landing and Dorchester Park neighborhoods and is bikeable and walkable from the nearby Auburn Trail. Future plans include a spray park / splash pad and outdoor court space.

Acreage: 47 Acres

Length of Trails: 2 Miles

Location: Paparone Drive off Brace Road, ½ mile south of NYS Route 96. Pedestrian / Bicycle entrance at East Street/Ellis Street.

MEAD SQUARE PARK

Mead Square Park is a small Village Park that provides respite to residents and visitors of our community. Linked to West Main Street through a curvilinear path, Mead Square offers opportunities for a casual lunch or reading a book which can be obtained from the nearby Library. There are several benches and flower gardens located throughout the park. Future plans could include expanding the park limits for event space, additional off-street parking and pedestrian and bicycle connectivity to local businesses, neighborhoods and community gathering spaces.

Acreage: .3 Acres

Location: Main Street and Mead Lane



FISHERS PARK

Victor's oldest, dedicated park contains five miles of looping trails that lead through wooded hillsides, through diverse wetland areas, and meander along the banks of Irondequoit Creek. At the main park entrance there is a picnic area with a recently completed stream bank stabilization project that increases the park's attraction as a top-class fishing destination! On the eastern side of the park there are four permanent pickleball courts and a tennis court with a large parking area. The park also has a year-round restroom located at the outdoor courts and a seasonal restroom facility in the picnic area. Future plans include an outdoor classroom / natural adventure play area.

Acreage: 93 Acres

Length of Trails: 5 Miles

Location: Main Street Fishers, Wangum Road and Old Dutch Road.

HARLAN FISHER PARK

With its location in the Village of Victor, this neighborhood park features a children's playground, picnic area, off-leash dog park (completed in 2024) and small parking area. The park has trail connections to Ambassador Drive and East Parkway. Dog Park passes can be obtained through the Town Clerk's office for a nominal, annual fee. Future plans include an expanded parking area and entrance drive, adventure play area / outdoor classroom, sidewalk connection to the Victorwood neighborhood and additional landscaping to celebrate this park's wonderful existing tree diversity.

Acreage: 6 Acres

Length of Trail: .5 Mile

Location: Lynaugh Road (Main Entrance)
Pedestrian / Bicycle Entrance at East Parkway and Ambassador Drive.

BOUGHTON PARK

Situated in the Town of East Bloomfield, this passive park has joint ownership by the Towns of Victor, East Bloomfield and West Bloomfield. The park includes two, large ponds, several miles of multi-use trails, canoe / kayak launches and racks and numerous places for a family picnic! Recommendations for the future include a lodge with restrooms, fishing docks and improvements to the park trail system. **The park is only open to residents of Victor, East Bloomfield and West Bloomfield. Park permits are free, but required by the independent Boughton Park Commission.**

Acreage: 330 Acres

Length of Trails: 5 Miles

Location: Two Entrances: East Bloomfield, Stirnie Road, ½ mile south of Town Line Road. Boughton Road, 2 miles west of NYS Route 444.



MARYFRANCES BLUEBIRD HAVEN

Fondly referred to as Victor's living classroom, Mary Frances Bluebird Haven's focus is on highlighting New York's official bird, the bluebird! The main trail that loops the perimeter of the park allows visitors to view bluebirds in their natural habitat along with various other species that reside in this passive park. Secondary mown trails weave through lush meadows and open spaces where nesting boxes can be seen. Mary Frances Bluebird Haven also has a cottage available for rentals and a fishing pond with an accessible fishing dock. The park also plays host to a community garden with fourteen plots available for planting your seasonal vegetables or flowers. Future plans include a trail connection to Village on the Park, an outdoor classroom, picnic shelter, and landscaping to complement the existing terrain.

Acreage: 39 Acres

Length of Trail: 1 Mile

Location: Victor-Egypt Road (across from Valentown Road intersection)

DRYER ROAD PARK

This park is a regional attraction and destination for mountain biking and trail use which also features a bike park including a pump track and jump line. The park has two natural surface soccer and lacrosse fields, an artificial turf box rink, year-round restrooms, picnic shelter, large children's playground and two-hundred vehicle parking area. The park plays host to a variety of community events including summer concerts, bike festivals, tournaments and sports league play. Future plans include an asphalt or concrete pump track and skate park, additional athletic fields, and expanded parking to the south.

Acreage: 132 Acres

Length of Trails: 15 Miles

Location: Dryer Road
